

2019 Premier 1 Competition Format & Playing Dates

- 1. The Premier 1 Competition will commence on Saturday 30th March with <u>10</u> teams.
- 2. The 10 teams will be split into two Pools of five teams (based on the 2018 Premier **1** Grade finishing order Pool Cardinal 1, 3, 5, 7, 9, Pool White 2, 4, 6, 8, 10).

- 3. The Grade will play a five week split round (Round 1) followed by a nine week full round competition (Round 2), with a three weeks finals structure. Total of 17 weeks.
- 4. To remove the Bye in both Pools teams will play a cross-over fixture in Round 1 based on the following 2018 Premier 1 grade finishing order 9v2, 8v3, 5v6, 10v1, 7v4 (the last five weeks of round 2 will be the reverse of these fixtures).
- 5. The kick-off time for **Premier 1** will be **2.45pm** (unless advised otherwise or indicated differently on the weekly draw).

6. <u>Points</u> are 4 for a win, 2 for a draw, 1 bonus point for scoring 4 + tries and 1 bonus point for finishing within 7 or less. A default win is 5 points.

Round 1 points will <u>carry forward</u> to Round 2 for the Premier Grade.

7. Premier 1 three week's finals structure. Teams will be ranked 1 to 10 from finishing positions *.

6th July:

Teams ranked 1 and 2 will have a Bye.

Team 4 plays Team 5 in Q2 (4v5)

Team 7 plays Team 10 in **Q3** (7v10)

Team 8 plays Team 9 in Q4 (8v9)

1 v lowest ranked winner of Q1 & Q2 (Semi-Final 1)

2 v highest ranked winner of Q1 & Q2 (Semi-Final 2)

Highest ranked loser of Q1 & Q2 v lowest ranked winner of Q3 & Q4 (Semi-Final 3)

Lowest ranked loser of Q1 & Q2 v highest ranked winner of Q3 & Q4 (Semi-Final 4)

Loser of Q3 v loser of Q4 (Bowl FINAL)

Finals 20th July

Championship Final – Winner Semi-Final 1 v Winner Semi-Final 2

Plate Final – Winner Semi-Final 3 v Winner Semi-Final 4

Premier 1 Competition Trophies:

- Round 1 Pool Winners (teams finishing top of the table within their respective Cardinal/White Pools *) will play
 for the Buck Shelford Shield when they meet each other in Round 2. The winner of this fixture will be the
 Premier 1 Round 1 Winner.
- The Les Pearce Memorial Shield is the Premier 1 grade challenge shield the opposition may challenge for the Shield at the home venue of the current holder. It is not played for during play-offs, semi-finals and finals.
- The Country Cup is a Premier grade challenge trophy competed for by the country clubs namely, Helensville, Kumeu, Mahurangi and Silverdale the opposition may challenge for the cup either at home or away to the current holder or during finals.
- The winner of the Premier 1 Championship Final receives the ASB Cup. The winner of the Plate Final receives the Pengelly Cup.
